Before joining UNHCR in 2004, he practiced as a lawyer and as a scientific researcher at the Universities of Munich and Würzburg. He has written on international refugee law and its impact on the national aliens law, as well as on several legal aspects of the European asylum system. In addition to his work with OSAR he is teaching European and European Asylum Law at the Universities of Bielefeld (Germany) and Fribourg. 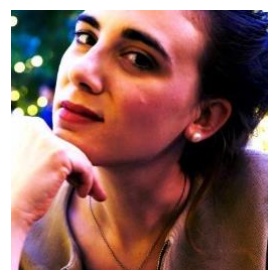

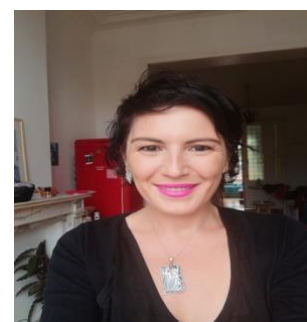

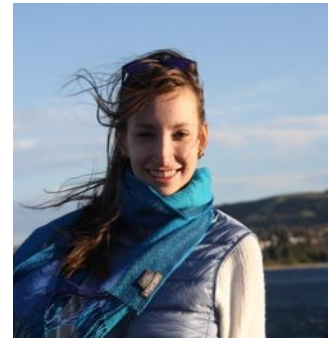
