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Overwhelming increase of influx via the eastern Mediterranean route

856.000 arrivals in 2015 almost 50% arrived in Lesvos. Dramatic loss of lives.
Death toll exceeds 3700.

The flow continues increasing, despite the winter period

62.716 arrivals into Greece from Turkey in January 2016

8.002 arrivals the first week of February

19.383 arrivals the second week of February



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In light of this emergency situation, European Council based on art 78(3) of the EU Functioning Treaty introduced the Emergency Relocation Mechanism by Decisions 2015 /1523 and 2015/1601 as responsibility and burden sharing system aiming to reinforce internal solidarity between the European Member States.

66,400 applicants for international protection to be transferred from Greece to Member States of Relocation over a period of 24 months.



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Beneficiaries of the relocation program are nationals of:

Syria, Iraq, Eritrea, Central African Republic, Yemen and Swaziland
and stateless persons with last residence the above mentioned
countries, may benefit from the program

Hotspots





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Asylum Service is the competent authority in Greece for the implementation of the asylum procedure, including the relocation program.

Upon entry into force of the EU Decisions, **Lesvos** was selected for the first pilot implementation of the project

Implementing partners and other stakeholders **UNCHR, EASO, FRONTEX, IOM** and the Asylum Service determined their roles, the areas of cooperation and synergies, aiming to come up with a coherent procedure from the moment of initial arrival in European territory through Greek external borders until the completion of the actual relocation transfers.



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UNCHR : humanitarian support, counseling on both the asylum procedure and the relocation program, referral to the Hellenic Police for the initial registration and provision of accommodation to relocation applicants from the moment of the lodging the application until the actual transfer.

Hellenic Police performs initial registration (identification, fingerprinting, photographing, security checks)

Frontex performing nationality screening and screening on documents' fraud

EASO experts : identification of eligible relocation candidates, provision of targeted information, referral to the closest Regional Asylum Office.



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Regional Asylum Offices receiving applications for international protection and registering asylum applicants in the relocation program.

Central Asylum Service/Relocation Unit processing of the application in cooperation with LO regarding all aspects of the procedure, matching, outgoing relocation requests, issue and notification of relevant decisions and preparation all necessary documents for the transfer. Referral to IOM for the remaining travel arrangements

IOM responsible for arranging the transfers and for medical screening, pre-departure counseling and orientation in cooperation with MRS LO's



Regional Asylum Office Lesvos - Started operating in September 2013

By the end of July 2015: six case workers plus two support staff

Response of MS of Relocation

Offers by few countries, only 16 out of 28 - still the program remains unconvincing

Indication of preferences in terms of nationality or specific profile of relocation candidates by MS, not provided for in the Council Decisions regarding Relocation. Only one MS so far accepts UAM

MS request de facto an additional step to the relocation process, that is to conduct in depth interviews with all relocation candidates prior to departure, even before accepting the relocation request.

Unjustified and/or inadequately justified rejections of relocation requests for reasons not provided in the decisions



Challenges

Need of active communication for establishing relocation as the only safe and legal way to settle in Europe. Asylum seekers' life plans, dreams, aspirations and wishes- changing already formed perceptions regarding their circulation and settlement in the European territory requires repeated counseling

MS to actively support the program and overcome the administrative impediments facilitating the actual transfer by all means

Rapid changes in MS asylum policies have a direct impact on the plans of asylum seekers and call for targeted and uniform information from all stakeholders involved (national authorities, EASO – UNCHR -IOM and NGO's)



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Relocation Program – future steps

Hotspots in the islands to be completed. Samos already operational. Works Chios and Leros almost completed. Kos progressing at a slower pace.

Willingness by EASO and UNCHR to “chaperone” asylum seekers through the relocation process and fill the void of smugglers. Important that UNCHR is offering reception for the relocation candidates

Authorities of MS and Liaison officers actively informing about the reception conditions in their country and consulting refugees to be relocated prior to transfer

IOM taking the lead in pre-departure counseling, medical checks and the organization of transfers.



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
