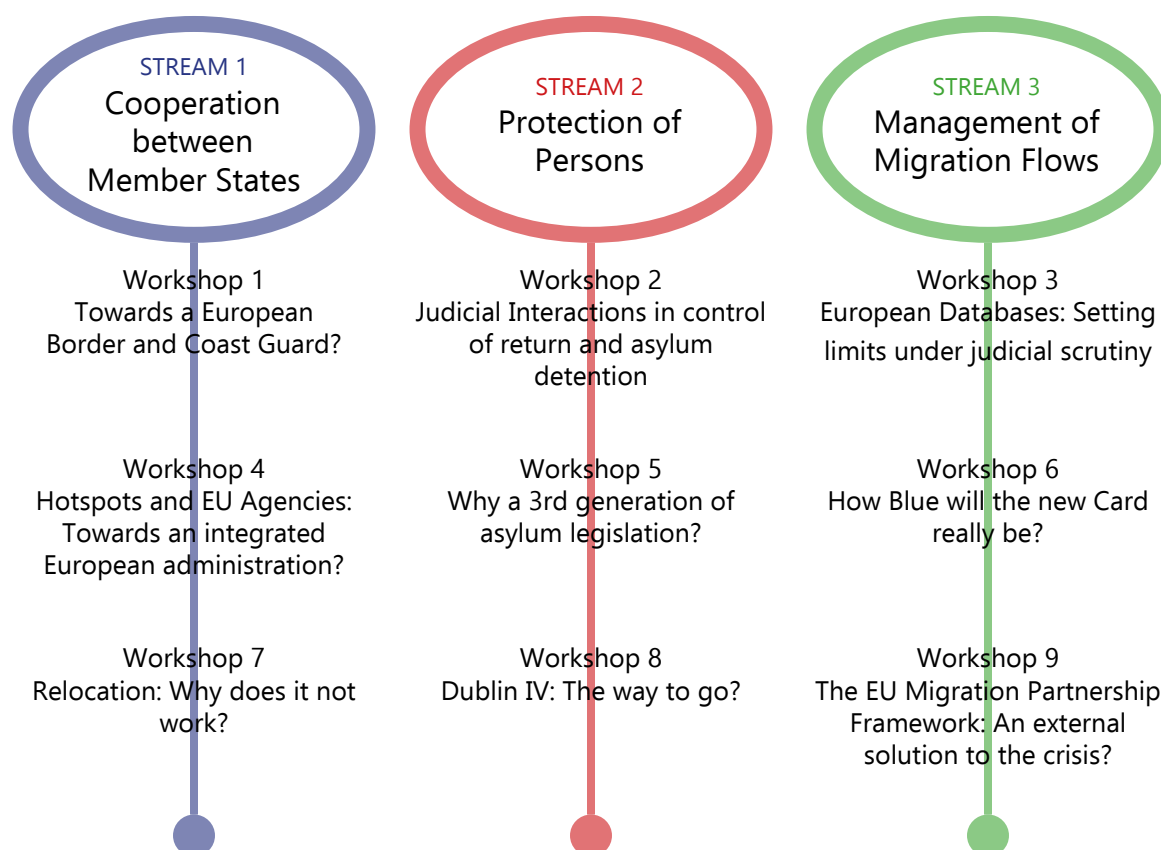
## OVERVIEW

The Odysseus Annual Conference is organised by the Odysseus Academic Network located at the Faculty of Law of the Université libre de Bruxelles. The Conference takes place on a yearly basis and in 2017 is organised jointly with the European Commission's Representation in Belgium, taking place on 10 February. Bringing together legal experts in immigration and asylum law and policy from across Europe, the event is conceptualised to take stock of the field's evolvments in 2016 and identify possible future trends.
